



Vec: Stručná správa o podujatí

V dnoch 21.-25.septembra 1992 sa koná v Domove vedeckých pracovníkov SAV v Smoleniciach medzinárodná konferencia : "Sociálna psychológia v roku 2000", ktorú ako podujatie /Meeting/ Európskej asociácie experimentálnej sociálnej psychológie organizuje Spoločenskovedný ústav SAV Košice. Účastníkmi sú poprední sociálni psychológovia z Európy a USA /celkový počet zahraničných účastníkov je 27/ ako aj slovenskí a českí sociálni psychológovia /počet 25/.

Hlavnými témami sú súčasné globálne sociálne a politické procesy a zmeny, z ktorých je veľká pozornosť venovaná etnickým otázkam a procesom demokratizácie, sociálnym konfliktom a ďalšiemu rozvoju sociálnej psychológie ako vednej disciplíny. Táto významná medzinárodná konferencia bola pripravená z iniciatívy Spoločenskovedného ústavu SAV v Košiciach za podpory EAESP, čo je prejavom ocenenia slovenskej a českej sociálnej psychológie a zároveň silným impulzom pre jej ďalší rozvoj.
