Doc. PhDr. Petr Kulišťák, Ph.D. / Associate Professor Petr Kulišťák, is a clinical neuropsychologist. In addition to teaching at the Charles University and Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education (clinical neuropsychology topics), he is also a Member of Ph.D. Committee in Clinical Psychology at Charles University. He is co-founder and vice-chair of Czech Neuropsychological Society and member of International Neuropsychological Society. He was Chair of neuropsychological section of Czech-Moravian Psychological Society for almost thirty years.

Although he has clinical experiences with psychiatric patients (especially child psychiatry), his professional career is focused on patients with neurological diagnoses. He works as a clinical neuropsychologist at Military Rehabilitation Center at Slapy nad Vltavou.

He translated many important manuals of neuropsychological batteries in Czech language (for instance WMS-R, VOSP, VSAT, The Modified Mini-Mental State Examination, The test of ideomotoric apraxia, MCST, TMT A/B, CLOX, Behavioural Assessment of the Dysexecutive Syndrome). He also participates on Czech adaptation and validation of some significant neuropsychological methods.

Fuelled by his fascination with the workings of the developing mind, he is author or coauthor of numerous of specialist articles and monographs, which promote development of clinical neuropsychology in the Czech Republic.

His current clinical and research interests include neuropsychological assessment and cognitive rehabilitation of patients suffering from diseases of central nervous system (cerebrovascular diseases, degenerative disorders, etc.).

He is leading expert of Luria's neuropsychological assessment and rehabilitation conception in Czech Republic.
