
Dear Dr. Kovac:

We have received the copy of PSYCHOLOGICKE STUDIE SAV III, and wonder whether you would be interested in an exchange of this journal for one of ours for one year.

For some time we have entered into exchange arrangements with journals in other countries, and have found the arrangements most helpful editorially.

Each of our journals contains a minimum of 600 pages per year, with additional pages in the form of monograph supplements appearing from time to time. Since January, 1960, publication is bimonthly, two volumes per year, with issues averaging in length as previously. The purpose of these cooperative, nonprofit journals is to encourage scientific originality and creativity. Both journals include experimental and theoretical articles, but differ in content emphasis. PSYCHOLOGICAL REPORTS includes articles in the field of general psychology; whereas articles in PERCEPTUAL AND MOTOR SKILLS deal with perception or motor skills. Enclosed are copies of our policy statements which will give you an idea of the format of the pages and the size of the journals.

Your early reply indicating which of our journals you prefer to receive will be most appreciated.
